Malindu captured this beautifully: "Looking back, it's not the big events that stand out, but the small moments. These are the memories that define who we have become and how we have grown together. We have learned so much, not just from textbooks and teachers, but from each other. We have discovered the true meaning of friendship, kindness, and love."

I see it among our visual artists, who speak of the importance of this department to them in feeling "at home", or in our athletes who wait all week for the Saturday game with the teammates they love. And I know you have found great joy and meaning in the connections.

Ella, with her metaphor of a rollercoaster, reminded us of the courage it takes to move forward: "At the very end, we all step off the ride. Our feet are on stable ground if only for a moment, and we look back at the track we were just on. Some of it was scary and hard, but part of me really wishes we could do it all again."
